Meet Our Beneficiaries for the 2019 Event

The Charity Selection Committee, with outstanding leadership from Bryan Hannley, delivered its recommendations for our 2019 charities to the Board. The Board approved the recommendations:

San Miguel High School. Recognizing the growing presence of teenage depression and suicide, following several recent incidents, the school is launching a health and wellness program that will include a full time social emotional counselor as well as fitness and art programs to bolster their mental health program. The Centurions are providing up to \$20,000 in matching funds for this program. San Miguel creates a learning community for students from families of limited financial

means.

Boys to Men Mentoring. Their School-Based Mentoring (SBM) Program currently provides weekly group mentoring services to around 150 mostly unfathered boys 11-17 years of age in eight urban-area middle and high schools in Tucson. They anticipate adding two additional high schools in 2018-19. The Centurions are providing \$40,000 for program and service support.

Youth on Their Own. Basic Human Needs for students are fulfilled through a "mini mall" to access food, clothing, school supplies, and hygiene products at no cost. An Emergency Financial Assistance Program for rent, medical bills or utilities is provided for those students who maintain grades and school attendance (heavily monitored). These stipends ease students' burden of having to work part time while attending school. The Centurions are providing \$20,000 split between those two programs.

And, of course, **Tucson Medical Center** is once again serving as both our primary beneficiary and presenting sponsor. The greater of \$150,000 or 50% of the 2019 Event's net revenue will go towards funding TMC's Newborn Intensive Care Unit (NICU).

Potential In-kind Support to Sunnyside H.S. Teenage Parenting Program

The Board also approved the Charity Selection Committee's recommendation to help put our members and their companies in touch with Sunnyside High School to provide in-kind help to expand its toddler child care center. The Centurions may also provide up to \$5,000 for materials and direct costs.

Although hard to imagine, when girls are becoming mothers in 8th or 9th grade, they lack the opportunity to have their child cared for in the current program when they are in 11th or 12th grade without support to care for their toddler. This effort is aimed at easing the burden to give those students an opportunity to succeed in their education.
